- A. Dr. Ezzeddine- Associate Vice President for Educational Outreach and International Programs- 44% of new students were transfer students. 52% of grads were transfers- majority are from community colleges. Have to make sure these students are supported and represented. Dual Enrollment- high schoolers taking Wayne State gen-eds. Consulting and training with Corporate Companies (ford/Chrysler). Sending instructors for elementary school students to learn math and English until the 8th grade and they then get transferred to another org. International Programs- 8% of student pop is international, goal is to get to 10%. 35 different study abroad programs. It is very important to provide students with a global experience. President wants to send double the amount of students to study abroad (from 500 to 1000). Michanda- do students from the different schools volunteer? For the literacy program? Dr.E- we have instructors, but are happy to take volunteers. Stuart- What do you hear/see about the biggest obstacle for transfer students? Dr.E- credits not transferring! Stuart- confusion on travel bans? Do the students know that they are protected? Dr.E- yes, students are always getting updates whenever things are happening or not happening. Ryan- increase/decrease in international enrollments? Dr.E- we have been getting less applications and enrollment may also be down. Students can be protected but the perception is not that way. Drop in Indian Students- H1 Visa is the main concern. A company must show that there isn't an American worker who is just as qualified and that they are not underpaid.
