 transfers are being taken into consideration and
 should be able to mix and match inquiries
 - ii. Jasmine- current inquiries depending on class?Bulletin can change if you wanted to but generally starts with the your first year at the University
 - iii. Abdul- honors college GenEds? Have to take the course regardless of AP? Some departments or programs will have requirements that overrule University Level Requirement; Point C- Wayne

- Experience/Wayne Foucs- its there to immerse students with peer mentors to become a part of an engage with the community and University
- iv. Daniel- taking classes that are seemingly unnecessary that students complain about?

 Definitely taking recommendations; Do you see conflicts arising with these 1 credit classes? No maybe not because there will be a lot of sections
- v. Kristina- quantitative experiences and old math competency? Binding only for a few number of students; What is it going to look like for freshman coming in with the rollout? After rollout, curriculum will be reviewed. And new courses proposed will have to be approved by Deans and GenEd Oversight Committee (GEOC)
