On Thursday, June 22nd, 2023, during the Board of Governors' Student Affairs Committee meeting, a presentation regarding a then-proposed Center for Gender and Sexuality was disrupted by Governor Michael Busuito's homophobic comments regarding the LGBTQIA+ community. Wayne State University Student Senate wants to make it clear that discrimination is not welcome at a university that prides itself on diversity, equity, and inclusion. Governor Busuito's comments do not represent the incredible LGBTQIA+ community at Wayne State and beyond.

Despite Governor Busuito's statements, the Center for Gender and Sexuality was approved, and the Student Senate is looking forward to its opening and continuing to support our campus. We are proud to stand behind a center that will provide our LGBTQIA+ community with a space to thrive, conduct research, and connect with peers in a supportive, welcoming, and encouraging environment.

Wayne State University's Student Senate disapproves of Governor Michael Busuito's comments during the Board of Governors meeting on June 22nd and will continue to advocate for our fellow students by following the university's mission of "prepar[ing] a diverse student body to thrive."
